**PARTNERSHIPS IN TRANSPORTATION WORKSHOP TO BE HELD
IN ST. LOUIS**

Washington D.C.—One of the fastest growing areas in public-private partnerships (PPPs) is transportation. With limited federal, state and local budgets, the issue arises of how to meet the demands of transportation infrastructure. Experts from both the public and private sectors will outline methods for mobilizing resources to successfully meet the challenge at the one-day Partnerships in Transportation: Funding Large Transportation Projects workshop in Missouri in September.

Set for September 29 at the Radisson Hotel & Suites in St. Louis, the educational workshop will be hosted by the National Council for Public-Private Partnerships, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Transportation, Illinois Department of Transportation, Missouri Department of Transportation, and St. Louis Regional Chamber & Growth Association.
